- The opportunity for Careers Advice Sessions with our Careers Advisors, Stacey Lowe
- Dedicated PSHE sessions every two weeks centred on the Curriculum Choices process as well as college and career sessions (including Kudos profile making (information within booklet)).
- Engage and Curriculum Choices Evening on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> February (further information to be given in due course)
  - This evening will include a pupil led market place where there will be an opportunity to speak to pupils currently studying all of the GCSE subjects to answer questions
- A Careers Fair with local and national businesses and employers, as well as local Colleges and Sixth Forms (Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February)
- Ongoing support from the Pupil Progress Team for Year 9, Mr Wiles and Miss Evans, before submission of the options forms on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February
- One-to-one coaching with Form Tutors during form time

Both you and your child are currently at the first step on the journey of choosing the best subjects for KS4 study. Please spend time going through the booklet with your child. As parents/carers, it important that you read through and understand the 'Important Points to Note' sections on pages 6 and 7 for additional information on our bespoke curriculum and amendments to the traditional grading system.
